



Danish Offshore Wind Roadshow in the Summer of 2018

In response to the increasing interest by Danish companies in the rapidly growing North American offshore wind sector, the Trade Council of Denmark in North America will host an offshore wind roadshow in collaboration with Offshoreenergy.dk in the summer of 2018. This event is for Danish offshore wind companies interested in working with American partners to further development of the supply chain across the Northeastern states.

The extensive interest in the offshore wind sector was very evident last week at two well-attended events organized by the Trade Council of Denmark: an industry-focused supply chain meeting in New York together with the policy-oriented “*Champions of Wind*” event at the Capitol in Washington D.C.. Given the industry interest on display at these events, an industry-focused roadshow is a logical next step. Ambassador Lars Gert Lose from the Embassy of Denmark commented;

“There is a pipeline of 25 gigawatts of wind projects offshore the U.S. and Canada. Of that total, 15 gigawatts are located in twelve commercial sites which have already been allocated to 8 states in the U.S. Northeast. Power offtake agreements have already been awarded in Maryland and more will be coming in Massachusetts, Rhode Island and possibly New York, in 2018.”

The Trade Council of Denmark and Offshoreenergy.dk have previously worked closely together, focusing on building supply chain partnerships between North American and Danish companies for U.S. offshore wind projects. The roadshow in summer of 2018 will have a similar focus that will further develop collaborative trans-Atlantic business opportunities.

Glenda Napier, CEO of Offshoreenergy.dk., added;

“The U.S. offshore wind industry is developing rapidly and Denmark has world-class offshore businesses that are eager to work with North American partners. For these reasons, it makes perfect sense for the Trade Council to pursue this initiative and I look forward to seeing this vision turned into reality”.

The Trade Council will continue its coordination with Offshoreenergy.dk in the coming months in order to determine details such as agenda, timing, which Danish companies will be involved, American companies and states to be visited and other specifics.
